



Service broadened

WIRELESS broadband provider Irish Broadband has moved into the fixed-line fast internet access market, and will compete against the likes of Eircom and BT Ireland.

The services will be provided in addition to its wireless services.

It will broaden the company's reach to a number of areas where its current services are unavailable, like parts of Mayo, Cavan and Galway. Irish Broadband will resell Eircom lines to provide the services.

"This will give us the same fixed network reach as any other operator in the State," said Irish Broadband boss Neil Parkinson.
